

Rules Sheet

USGA Rules govern all play.

Local Rules:

- Winter Rules are in effect...This entitles player to improve their lie anywhere on the golf course except on the greens. Players can move their ball no more than a scorecard, and no nearer the hole. Should the players ball come to rest in an area, on the golf course, bare of grass, then the player can move the ball to the nearest point with grass, even if that area is more than one scorecard from where their ball originally came to rest.
- The deep grass (No-Mow)...is treated as an environmental area. This entitles the player affected to a FREE DROP with no penalty. However, the player affected by the No-Mow must find and identify their ball, without such identification, the ball is considered lost. Relief must be taken from the point where the ball last crossed into the No-Mow. If your ball comes to rest so near the No-Mow that your swing is impeded by the grass, you can take relief. (Relief is taken by dropping your ball no nearer the hole and no more than 2 club lengths from the point of entry, into the environmental area).
- Each participant is given 5-minutes to look for a lost ball.
- Motorized Carts...Under no circumstances are contestants allowed to ride in the cart during their competitive round.
- Putting practice...On the green just completed is prohibited.
- Out of Bounds...Defined by White Stakes
- Water Hazards...Defined by the water level of the pond, if ball is touching water in the pond, then it is deemed to be in the hazard. If ball is not touching the water then it is deemed to be in the No-Mow, and relief under that environmental hazard shall be taken as defined above.
- Players in divisions 1, 2, 3, and 9 can limit their per hole score to double that of par (e.g. score limit of 8 on a par 4)
